

Historic Granger Homes

If you or someone you know in Granger has a very old house...

The Granger Bicentennial Committee would like to recognize the owners of some of Granger's oldest homes. As a cut-off, we set the year 1857 because on the wall at the Granger Historical Society we have a large county map that shows the location of the homes at that point. If you think your home dates to 1857 or earlier, we'd be happy to help you do the research to find out for sure. The Granger Historical Society's library building will be open on Memorial Day, May 30 from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m. and on Saturday, June 4 from 1-3 p.m. There is a wealth of information that can help you determine your home's history. We'll also have a handout created by Jeff Foose that will help you find other sources of information about your home and its owners.

If you determine your home to date back to at least 1857, we will recognize you at our Bicentennial Opening Ceremony. We also invite you to create a small display of photos, documents, research findings, or objects depicting your home. We're sure the guests at the historical society will be fascinated by your displays. The display cannot exceed 18"x18" due to limited table space.
